SACID works with Inclusion Australia by representing South Australians with intellectual disability




You will work on a project called *Towards Inclusive Practice*

Things you will do in the job



You will attend regular meetings with other peer workers.



Provide information to the Government on how to better understand and support people with intellectual disability.



Be part of a national network with people in other states and territories.

You may be asked to help run workshops to help Government better understand people with intellectual disability.



There might be travel to other states.

What you must be able to do



Be interested in the rights of people with intellectual disability



Work Independently

- Follow Instructions



Speak Up

- Ask for help if you need it
- Talk about issues that affect people with intellectual disability
- Ask questions



Work with others

- Work well with other people
- Be respectful to others

Work safely



- Follow our policies and procedures.
- Let the Project Officer know if you see something unsafe while working.
- Participate in training about keeping safe at work.
- Get a **Working with Children Check** from the Department of Human Services.
- This is a check to make sure you are safe to work with people with disability and children.
- If you do not have one, SACID can help you to get it.

Transport



- You will need to travel to the office
- You do not have to have a license
- You could catch public transport
- You could have a support worker drive you
- It will be up to you to organise your transport to and from work and to work events

Interstate travel



- You might travel to other states
- This will depend on how the project is doing and if there are any COVID19 restrictions on travel
- You might need to stay in a hotel overnight
- Inclusion Australia will pay for the travel
